Just plane art

Look, in the sky! It's a bird! It's a plane! It's . . . sky art?

A 20-by-60-foot banner bearing a painting by Michael Klant will be towed by airplane over East Central Florida from 4 to 7 p.m. today. The plane (which will not be piloted by the artist) will fly a route from Edgewater north to Daytona Beach and over the Southeast Museum of Photography, then south to the Kennedy Space Center, then northwest to DeLand.

Klant's painting depicts the sky as seen from a mountain in the Black Forest of Germany. Earthbound spectators can witness the banner sail to the ground from a height of 300 feet when it's jettisoned around 7 p.m. today over DeLand Airport.

Banner flight update

There will be an attempt to fly Michael Klant's German Sky Piece banner today, if the weather is good.

Originally planned for last weekend, the giant piece of art in the sky will start from Edgewater at 1 p.m., head south to Cape Canaveral, then over DeLand and end with jettisoning the banner over SkyDive DeLand at around 3 p.m. If the weather is bad, it will be attempted at the same time Sunday.
